



Nicholas Chopey Scholarship Program

THE PROGRAM

Chemical Engineering Magazine has established a scholarship program to assist students who plan to continue their education in college programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at one of five eligible four-year institutions.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship Management Services[®], a division of Scholarship America[®]. Scholarship Management Services is the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship and tuition reimbursement programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, age, gender, disability or national origin.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Nicholas Chopey Scholarship Program must be current third-year students who are enrolled in a full-time* undergraduate course of study in Chemical Engineering at one of the following four-year colleges or universities:

- ◆ Columbia University,
- ◆ Rutgers University,
- ◆ SUNY Buffalo,
- ◆ University of Kansas,
- ◆ University of Virginia

**Full-time study is defined as full-time enrollment for the entire upcoming academic year.*

AWARDS

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a one-time only award that may be used for undergraduate study only.

APPLICATION

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship Management Services postmarked no later than **April 1, 2008**. Grade reports are not acceptable. Online transcripts must display student name, school name, grade and credit hours earned for each course, and term in which each course was taken. Applicants will receive acknowledgment of receipt of their application. If an acknowledgment card is not received within three weeks, applicants may call Scholarship Management Services to verify that the application has been received.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. All information received is considered confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship Management Services.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal. Financial need is not considered.

Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship Management Services. In no instance does any officer or employee of *Chemical Engineering Magazine* play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final.

Applicants will be notified in early June, 2008. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship Management Services processes Nicholas Chohey Scholarship payments on behalf of *Chemical Engineering Magazine*. Payments are made in equal installments on August 15, 2008 and December 30, 2008. Checks are mailed to each recipient's home address and are made payable to the school for the student.

OBLIGATIONS

Recipients have no obligation to *Chemical Engineering Magazine*. They are, however, required to notify Scholarship Management Services of any changes in address, school enrollment, or other relevant information and to send a complete transcript when requested.

REVISIONS

Chemical Engineering Magazine reserves the right to review the conditions and procedures of this scholarship program and to make changes at any time including termination of the program.
